New Year - New Website



Weather Appropriate Clothing

Playground Safety and Supervision

Students are not to be arriving at school before 8:45 am and must come directly into the school upon arrival. There is no supervision for students arriving early to play before school. Any students staying after school to play must be with an adult.

February Is Registration Month

In the HRCE, February is traditionally registration month. Registering new students in February allows the system to ensure that staffing, done in the spring for the next school year, is accurate at each school. Families are required to register online.

All students who are currently attending Saint Mary's Elementary, including those in pre-primary at Inglis Street Elementary, do not need to re-register. If you know anyone with a child who will be 4 or 5 by Dec. 31, 2024, please let them know that we are accepting registrations for pre-primary and primary. Inclement Weather and School Cancellations

In the event of school cancellation due to inclement weather and other exceptional circumstances, the decision to cancel school is made as close to 6:00 am as possible. Here are some ways you can find out:

At times, schools may be cancelled by "Family of Schools". We are in the Citadel High family of schools. In the event school is cancelled during the school day, the decision is usually made by 11 am. The school will contact all families to confirm procedures to release your children. Please ensure your child knows what to do in case of early closure and ensure that your phone numbers and email addresses are up-to-date so we can contact you. Students are not released until we have made contact with a parent/guardian or designate as you identified on the registration forms sent home in September.

If school is cancelled during the day, we will dismiss students as per their parent/guardian instruction at 11:30. If you can avoid it, do not come to pick your child up early as this will result in a number of parents/guardians in close contact. Parents, guardians and caregivers are requested to wait outside their regular dismissal door at 11:30 for their children. All students who need to wait for a later pick-up will be supervised until they are picked up.

On days when conditions exist that it is not safe to open schools at the regularly scheduled time but it is predicted that conditions will improve, a 2-hour delayed opening may be considered. In this situation, students cannot arrive before 10:45 and classes will begin at 10:55. Lunch and dismissal times will not be affected.
