Weather Notes

As we are now moving into April, we start looking forward to increasingly better weather and longer days. Activity, movement and fresh air help us learn, so we believe it's very important that students get outside to play as much as possible. This means that we go out most days, even when it's chilly or lightly raining. When classes go out for recess and lunch, all students must accompany their class. Teachers and lunch monitors are responsible for the students outside, and there are no extra staff to supervise students who do not go out. Please ensure that students are dressed appropriately for the weather each day.

As we get further into spring, there will be mud and puddles to explore in the school yard. We recommend tucking a change of clothes in your child's backpack in the event they get wet or dirty while playing outside. This will help us avoid calling you to drop off clean, dry clothes.

Preparing for the Solar Eclipse

The Department of Education and Early Childhood Development is pleased to provide all students in Nova Scotia with eclipse glasses to view the upcoming solar eclipse safely. School staff will be sending home those glasses just prior to the event.

A solar eclipse occurs when the moon passes between the Earth and the sun, obscuring the view of the sun from a section of the Earth. This event is extremely rare, with the next solar eclipse not occurring in the province until 2079. Nova Scotia will be just outside of the zone of totality for the solar eclipse; for this reason, it is important that individuals have appropriate protection to view this historic event.

The solar eclipse will begin at 3:27 p.m., reaching maximum coverage at 4:38 p.m., and ending at 5:44 p.m. For more information, visit https://thediscoverycentre.ca/solar-eclipse-solaire/.
