Track and Field

Some of our Grade 4, 5 and 6 students will be participating in Track and Field meets on Tuesday, June 4th (Gr. 6) and Wednesday, June 5th (Gr. 4 & 5) at Beazley Field in Dartmouth. June 6th and 7th have been set aside as rain dates.

Each age group (4/5 and 6) competes separately. Girls and boys compete separately as well. Within each age group, we are allowed to take 3 participants in long jump, 800 m and 1500 m. We can take 4 participants in 100 m, 8 in 4x100 m relay and 4 in the ball throw. Students are allowed to participate in a maximum of 2 events plus the relay. Participation is mostly based on performance but the size of our school makes it easier for our students to make one of the teams. Mr. McDougall is busy preparing interested students and will communicate with families when the participant lists have been finalized. There will be no cost to attending the event, however students and their families will be responsible for transportation to and from Beazley Field each day. School staff will be on hand at the event but parents/guardians are welcome to stay and watch.


24/7 Access: Anytime access to video tutorials, practice questions and vocabulary review.

2024-25 EXCEL registration

The EXCEL program is a recreation-based, fee-for-service before and after school program run by the Halifax Regional Centre for Education, offering before and after school care for elementary-aged children.

At each school site, the dedicated and qualified staffing teams plan weekly games and activities that suit the needs and interests of the registered students. These individual plans are framed around EXCEL's overall philosophy which is focused on physical activity and positive social interaction in a safe and fun environment.

Volunteering and Field Trips

Classes are beginning to prepare for school trips as we head into the end of the school year. If you would like to volunteer as a chaperone, it is a requirement of HRCE to have a recent Child Abuse Registry Check and Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector on file within 3 months of date of issue. We can provide you with a letter that gives a discount on the Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector fee so please contact the office if you are interested. If any associated fees are a concern for you, please reach out to us.

The Child Abuse Registry application form is free and can be completed on-line.
